SOLAR CYCLE 24 BEGINS...

SpaceWeather.com reported on January 4th that that the first sunspot of the new sunspot cycle 24 was seen on the sun's surface. Sunspots of the new cycle are magnetically reversed as compared to those of the waning cycle 23, and appear at higher latitudes, in this case 30 degrees north. The first identified sunspot of the new cycle doesn't guarantee an increased sunspot number anytime soon, but it's an indication that we are at least near the very bottom of the cycle. The ARRL's K7RA Propagation Update reports the latest NASA estimate for the bottom of the cycle is now sometime between December 2007 and April 2008. There still appears to be a split consensus on whether the next cycle will be a strong or weak one. Only time will tell. In the meantime, keep up on the latest space weather at www.SpaceWeather.com .
